A LETTER FROM FATHER AARON

"The Family That Prays Together, Stays Together." Dear Friends,

In 2020 the movie "Pray" was released which featured Father Patrick Peyton, a priest from Ireland, who originally came to the United States to sell real estate and eventually entered the seminary at the University of Notre Dame. Father Peyton was ordained in 1941 as priest of the Holy Cross Fathers and he became a renown mission preacher. Venerable Father



Peyton, whose cause for canonization to Sainthood has been opened, made a significant impact on the United States. He preached over 550 missions, and in 1961, he drew over a half-million people to Golden State Park in San Francisco for a rosary rally, one of the largest gatherings in San Francisco to this day.

Father Peyton often preached about the importance of family prayer and the rosary. He spoke with passion and often brought people to tears with his sincere and zealous preaching. He coined the famous quote, "The family that prays together stays together."

I am inspired by Father Peyton's passion for God and his desire to bring people to him through prayer. I have used Father Peyton's quote many times as I believe deeply in the power of family prayer. Our world is in a state of disarray in many ways and will only find sanity in Our God, the Creator. We must find our peace in the loving hands of our Good Father who is always present to us.

One reason that our parishes are currently discerning family faith formation is so that parents can lead their children in prayer and catechesis. When a child sees a father or mother praying at home or kneeling in church, it has most profound effect that will last for years. The opposite effect will be had if the child does not see their parent praying and taking their faith seriously. Please pray for the discernment of the faith formation programs.

My friends, I ask that you also please pray for our families, for their salvation and holiness of life, that they would be built up in the peace and love of God. Pope St. John II once said, "As the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live." The impact of one family who prays together and lives their faith can be truly amazing. Prayer changes the world. God bless you,

FAITH FORMATION OFFICE

What does it mean to say that the family is the domestic church? Since the very foundation of the Early Christian Church, fathers have been called the "priests" of their homes. Throughout scripture, over 87 times in fact, we see allusions to this unique role of the father figure within the family. The Church, reflecting on both Scripture and Tradition, describes "the role of parents in education" to be of "such



importance that it is almost impossible to provide an adequate substitute" and that "the right and the duty of parents to educate their children are primordial and inalienable" (CCC 2221). The role and responsibility of the parents as the primary educators of their children is rooted in God's vision of the family.

We, as a church community, must come to recognize that, despite the whole-hearted efforts of our CCD teachers, the most effective means of passing on the faith does not happen in the classroom. Pope Paul VI reminds the faithful that "...the first means of evangelization is the witness of an authentically Christian life... modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses" (Evangelization in the Modern World 45). As we have stated, it is the role of parents to be the primary educators and thus, the primary witnesses to the faith such that they lead their children to become fully mature and intentional disciples of Jesus Christ. However, is only when parents themselves become mature disciples, leading lives as authentic witnesses of Christ, that they are truly able fulfill their educational role. Being a disciple is the vocation of every baptized person and no educational method or model can offer more success in making disciples of our children then parents modeling discipleship as living witnesses of the faith.

The family catechesis model of faith formation we are considering for our parishes in the upcoming year is designed to uphold the Church's vision of education primarily through encouraging and equipping parents to be the spiritual leaders of their homes. In practice, this model is for K-6th graders and their parents. It entails a once-a-month in person session and 3 brief monthly family home lessons. More details on this model are yet to come. <u>An informational meeting for parents, teachers, and any interested parishioners will take place on Wednesday, June 8th at 6:30pm at Assumption.</u>



Totus Tuus (Latin for "Totally Yours") is a program which takes four young adult missionaries who tour the diocese and spread the love of God to all they encounter. <u>The Totus Tuus team will be coming to Assumption June 27-July 1.</u>

-During the day, youth in grades 1-6 participate in games, Mass, skits, and class. They are given opportunities to go to Confession, ask questions, pray, and of course, have a blast!

-In the evening, youth in grades 7-12 experience the joy of a parish youth group. Games, adoration, a talk from one of the missionaries and small groups all add up to an engaging, meaningful, and enjoyable experience.

Would Jesus Watch TV With You?

There were many great take-a-ways from Dcn Poyo's Lenten Mission, but one that keeps coming to mind is ways that evil can sneak into our lives to knock us off our narrow path to heaven. One question that he was asked us was, "would Jesus sit on the couch next to you and watch TV with you?" Are we watching inappropriate things? Are we risking our minds being



darkened and dulling our sense of sin? You might think it's harmless, but is it really?

A few years ago, I listened to a talk on a Lighthouse Catholic Media CD (you can now find it on FORMED!) called "What's on Your IPod?". It's a bit dated now, but I recently listened to it again and the truth of it still rings out. Unless you make a concerted effort to keep unsavory things out of your life, things will creep in. What's popular and catchy can be hard to resist. I used to fall into the trap of liking an artist or the tune of a song without actually taking in the meaning of the words. It's a real eye opener when you read the lyrics and realize what you've been singing along to!

What is there to do about it? Become aware and learn your options! There are good alternatives out there. Relevant Radio, Spirit 92.9 and FORMED are all great options. As a parent, I like to make sure to read the parent's guides for movies that put in detail the number and kind of swear words, sexual scenes and violence that a movie has. There is PureFlix that is essentially a "Christian Netflix". There is also a movie filtering service called VidAngel that will link up with your other streaming services and filter out certain content that is set by you. That way you can watch a movie without the extra, unnecessary swear words or other unsettling content.

So next time you sit down with your bowl of popcorn to watch a movie, ask yourself, "would Jesus watch this with me?"
